Widmore, more or lesse, belonginge unto me, ther payning out of the sayde Landes twelle pounds
yearly by tyme to my sayde children (that is to say) Thomas Ambrose, Edward Eliz.
Roſe and Brigit duringe the tyme of twelte yeres nexte after my decess. Item I will geve
and bequately unto every of my children, children twentie shillinges, to be payde unto them all
ther severall ages of tyme tyme. And if it shall happen any of my children to deceſſe
before they shall come to thir tyme that is appoynted by my will, then I will that thir
legarites shalbe debidde amongst my sayde children wch shalbe then living. Item I will geve
and bequately unto my twote ffrendes Agnes and Janet tyghtes of Lymington Shillinges (that is
to say) To michele Shillinges to be payde unto her whiche either of them dwelle shillinges.
Item I will and bequately to the poore people in Stratford to be payded to hem in forme
yēars nexte after my decess the summe of fforis paymed. All the residue of my good
estate undebte ad promutable (my debtes beinge paid, my funeral chāre beinge done)
I will will give and bequately unto Janet Falſon and Robert my sonnes, whiche if doe nominate
and execte to be my exectutors of tēs my last will and testement. By me Janet Brag

Defendour of the faith etc. ¶ **I Marke Dowlinge** of Walden in the Comteie of
Essex beinge sick in body but of good and perfecte minde and remembreance (lende and preſte
be given to deliue to God therfore) Doe make and ordene this my present testamēt touching
mine threwe my last will in manner and forme following (that is to say). First and before
all thinges I gybe and remmende my soule into the handes of almighty god, trusſinge to be
saved by and throuthe the merites of his sonne Christ Jesu, and my bader to the
same from rebute of minde to be buried at the diſcrecion of myne exectutors therinafter
named at the diſcrecion of rayn Exectore h[ab]et named or otherwise ordyned. Item I
will give and deſire to Madge my wif d[omi]n[u]m t[em]p[or]is h[ab]et with thappertenancys p[ro]p[ri]etatis
and beinge in Leyton in the Comteie of Quickege; To haue and to hold the sayde h[ab]et
wth thappertenancys to the sayde Madge my wif, and to her heire for eu. Item I gybe and
bequately to Kogge Dowlinge my ffrendes Tene poundes of latofull Englyſh monney
To be payded to the said Kogge Dowlinge in and vpon the fyfth and twentie daye of this
instante monthe of Decembrie abobe written or in fforis dayes ther nexte after. Item I gybe

 of and in or to the same, to the use of the sayde Madge my wif and to her heire for ever at all
 times and tymes when so the sayde William or his heire shallbe required. Item
 I will that Madge my wif her executors or assignors shall paye or cause to be payed vpon
 the first and twentieth daye of this instant moneth of December above written sixe dayes thereafte
 neyther before or after the sayde William Dowling my brother to the use of his foile childeun ffor
 pounds of lawfull English money (that ys to say) to eche of them Tenne pounds a pette
 to be severally payd to the saide severall childeun at this sevralle age of one and twenty yeres
 and the succidous or survidour to haue the rest that shallbe unpaid. Item If give & bequeath
 to Margerie (my sister) nowe the wif of John Compter of Chirchstow in this County of Cambridg
 Tenne pounds of lawfull money of England to be payd to her the sayde Margerie in and
 vpon the first and twentieth daye of this instant moneth of December above written or no leſſ
 sixe dayes thereafte. Item I will that Madge my wif her executors or assignors shall
 paye or cause to be payed vpon the first and twentieth daye of this instant moneth of December
 above written or no leſſ sixe dayes thereafte to the sayde John Compte to the use of his
 thre childeun Thricke pounds of good and lawfull money of England (that is to saye
 of them) Tenne pounds a pette, to be severally payd to his sayde severall childeun at this
 sevralle age of one and twenty yeres, and the succidous or survidour to haue the rest
 that shallbe unpaid. Item If give & bequeath to Madge my brude Tenne shillings
 to be payde immediately after my decease. Item I will to the poore in Walden Twenty
 shillings to be distributed emongest them immediately after my decease. Item I will to the
 poore people of Chirchstow twenty shillings to be distributed to them by or at the distribution
 of the sayde John Compter and Richard Ellio. Item all the residue of my Goods
 and chattels moveable householdstuffe, cloth, money, and all other things whiche shalbe by
 weight name or named sover they be called or named (unbenequated) my debtes and fuentales beinge
 payd and discharged I will abyde and further give and bequeath them unto Madge my wif, &
 whiche I haue hereunto set my hande and seal by hys beng, witness C. N. Nichols

 Taylors and, bynesfide the wif of the same Peter Bullebrook, Memorandum that
