³ Lt. Colonel Jordan served with the 34th Regiment in the Crimea from Feb. to 9th July 1855, including the siege of Sebastopol, sortie of the 22nd March, capture of the Rifle-pits 19th April, sortie of 9th May, and assault of the Redan on the 18th June—severely wounded (mentioned in despatches, Medal with Clasp, Brevet of Major, 5th Class of the Medjidie, Sardinian and Turkish Medals). Served in the Indian campaign, including the actions at Cawnpore on 26th, 27th, and 28th (wounded) November 1857 (Medal).

⁴ Major Puget served with the 34th Regiment in the Crimea from 9th Dec. 1854, including the siege of Sebastopol (Medal with Clasp, and Turkish Medal). Also in the Indian campaigns in 1857–59, including the actions at Cawnpore on 26th, 27th, and 28th Nov. 1857, capture of Meerangunge, siege and capture of Lucknow, relief of Aizimghur, defeat of the rebels near Bootwul, and commanded Detachment 34th Regiment at the affair at Bhowanie—mentioned in despatch (Medal with Clasp).

⁵ Captain Chapman served with the 34th Regiment in the Crimea from the 9th Dec. 1854, including the siege and fall of Sebastopol (Medal with Clasp, and Turkish Medal).

⁶ Captain Laurie served with the 34th Regiment in the Crimea from the 10th August 1855, including the siege and fall of Sebastopol, and was severely wounded at the assault of the Redan on the 8th September, was also wounded on a former occasion (Medal with Clasp, and Turkish Medal). Served also in the Indian campaigns in 1858–59, including the capture of Meerangunge, siege and capture of Lucknow, relief of Aizimghur, defeat of the rebels at Bootwul, and affair at Bhowanie (Medal with Clasp).

⁷ Captain Hill served with the 23rd Fusiliers in the Indian campaign of 1857–58, including the siege and capture of Lucknow, and operations across the Goomtee (Medal with Clasp).

⁸ Captain R. J. P. Leeson served with the 34th Regiment in the Crimea from the 29th July 1855, including the siege and fall of Sebastopol and assault of the Redan on the 8th September (Medal with Clasp, and Turkish Medal). Served also in the Indian campaigns in 1857–59 as Adjutant of the 34th Regiment, including the actions at Cawnpore on 26th, 27th, and 28th Nov. 1857, capture of Meerangunge, siege and capture of Lucknow, relief of Aizimghur, and as Staff Officer to Lt. Colonel Simpson's Column on the Nepal Frontier, and present at the defeat of the rebels at Bootwul (Medal with Clasp).

⁹ Captain Malcolm served with the 34th Regiment in the Indian campaign in 1857–59, including the actions at Cawnpore on 26th, 27th, and 28th Nov. 1857, siege and capture of Lucknow, and defeat of the rebels at Bootwul (Medal with Clasp).

¹¹ Captain Pennefather served with the 83rd Regiment in the Indian mutiny campaign, including the siege of Kotah and its capture by assault on the 30th March 1858 (Medal).

¹² Captain Tufnell served with the 93rd Highlanders at the relief of the Garrison of Lucknow in Nov. 1857, at the defence of Cawnpore and defeat of the Gwalior mutineers there and at Seria Ghat, also present at the action of Kalee Nuddee (Medal with Clasp).

¹³ Captain Jordan was present at the affair at Bhowanie on 28th April 1859 (Medal).

¹⁵ Lieut. Boggs served with the 55th Regiment on the Bhootan expedition in 1865 (Medal with Clasp).

¹⁶ Major Rowan served with the 34th Regiment in the Crimea from the 9th Dec. 1855, including the siege and fall of Sebastopol (Medal with Clasp, and Turkish Medal). Also in the Indian campaigns in 1857–59, including the actions at Cawnpore on 26th, 27th, and 28th Nov. 1857, capture of Meerangunge, siege and capture of Lucknow, relief of Aizimghur, and Brigade Quarter Master to Colonel Kelly's Force engaged in the operations on the Nepal Frontier, and present at the defeat of the rebels at Bootwul (Medal with Clasp).

¹⁷ Quarter Master O'Neill served with the 34th Regiment during the rebellion of 1838–39 in Canada. Served in the Crimea from February 1855, including the siege and fall of Sebastopol (Medal with Clasp, Medal for Distinguished Conduct in the Field, and Turkish Medal). Served in the Indian mutiny campaigns of 1857–59, including the actions at Cawnpore on the 26th 27th and 28th November 1857, and subsequent defence of the town; operations on the Nepal Frontier and Trans-Gogra district (Medal). Also Medal for Long Service.

¹⁸ Surgeon Alder.—For War Services see "Medical Department."
